



Facilities Policy

1. Context

Al-Faisal College – Campbelltown is equipped with exceptional facilities to enhance student learning. The grants that the school has received such as the BER, Low SES National Partnerships and funding from the State and Federal Government have significantly improved the equipment and resources available to students in order to meet their learning needs.

A key purpose of this document is to address how the mandatory requirements of each course the school offers to deliver the Record of School Achievement (RoSA) and Higher School Certificate (HSC) are met.

2. Onsite Facilities

Some of the onsite facilities include:

- Library
- Multi-purpose hall
- Playground areas
- Specialised rooms such as: computer laboratories, science laboratory, design and technology room, music room, food technology room etc

2.1 General Classrooms

All general classrooms at Al-Faisal College – Campbelltown have many features that facilitate learning. Each classroom is fitted with a white board, SMART/Team board, data projector and internet access. The flexibility of setting up learning areas that enable individual, small group or whole class activities owing to movable chairs and tables (seating arrangement) promotes diversity in students' learning styles.

2.2 The Library

The Library offers comprehensive computer and research facilities. Students have access to an extensive number of books that can be used for subject specific projects or enjoyment. Students are encouraged to visit the library to borrow Premier Reading Challenge books as well as search for information in the research/computer area. The library also offers opportunities for lessons to be conducted and senior students to study (Years 11-12) in designated areas.

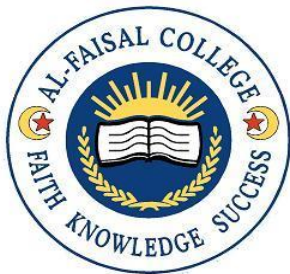
2.3 Multipurpose Hall - Indoor Space

The Multipurpose hall is used for a variety of events, which creates great opportunities for the community to attend community functions and workshops. Parents and students can also access the hall for assemblies, school meetings, presentation days, social events, formal examinations, drama and indoor sports.

2.4 Playgrounds – Outdoor Space

The playgrounds at Al-Faisal College play a vital role in providing students with space to participate in sporting programs that promote physical strength, coordination and balance. The playgrounds are also used in multiple ways such as:

- Undercover area – setting up activities / meeting areas / alternate activities owing to wet weather



- Mathematics – using the outdoor area to generate tallies / graphs / measuring length
- Science / HSIE - Conducting experiments / focusing on the role of the environment
- Socially – students are able to interact with others during recess/lunch

3. Specialist Classrooms

3.1 Computer Laboratories

Computer labs are equipped with SMARTboards/ Team boards and provide students with access to the internet. Additionally specialist application programs enable students to enhance their ICT skills and gain knowledge relevant to the KLA offered/studied. The computer laboratories also provide an optimum learning environment as students can acquire information for; research, assessments, presentations, online activities etc.

3.2 Science Laboratories

Science laboratory is fully equipped and fitted with fume cupboards, work benches (for practical experiments), chemical storage, storage shelves/cupboards for all glassware and equipment.

3.3 Visual Arts Rooms

The Visual Art Rooms are fitted with SMART/Team boards, data projects with internet access, wet areas, large cupboards and shelves for storage of art materials/supplies/tools and drying areas for art works.

3.4 Design and Technology Room

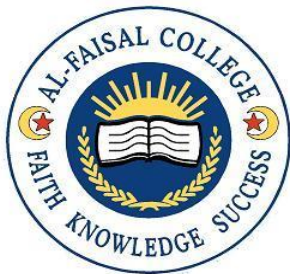
Technology rooms including access to the computer laboratories enable students to undertake Visual Arts and Textiles.

Safety is a key feature for use of any technology / textile room. The room is equipped with tools and equipment such as sewing machines, drawing etc.

- Access to school library

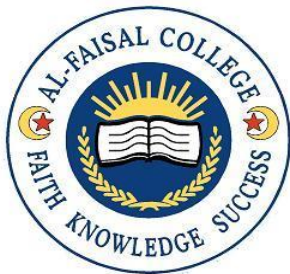

6. Emergency Procedures and Relevant Facilities

Evacuations and lockdowns are carried out ensuring that students and staff are aware of procedures and safety at Al-Faisal College. Disability provisions are in place with a wheelchair ramp and elevators providing safe access to all floors. **All general classrooms are lockable** and provide safety from intruders in the case of a lockdown.

7. The current standard and state of repair of facilities

All WHS issues that may arise from day to day are recording in the Al-Faisal College Maintenance book unless it is an issue of an urgent nature, which is reported to the Head of College - Campbelltown immediately.

The WHS committee, which comprises of general class and specialist teachers hold meetings to ensure that all appropriate actions carried out in order to maintain the safety of equipment used at the School. The Risk Assessment checklist is used for a means of identifying possible safety risks in the specialist rooms (**Refer to WHS Policy & Risk Management Policy**).
